I want to comment on how the plan should be improved to better meet duties to disabled people under the Equality Act. Specifically I think you should consider INCREASING the proportion of Accessible Parking beyond the bare minimum laid out in the draft plan.

The principle of using maximum/limited parking standards in urban area served well by frequent public transport or in sustainable locations is supported, subject to provision of sufficient car parking spaces for users with specific mobility requirements.

All new or amended developments must be required to demonstrate proportionate provision of "blue badge" or similar bays. This is a fundamental element of tackling

inequality in access to employment, services and residential uses. Such spaces should also be of sufficient dimensions to allow room for a disabled person to move around their vehicle and/or assemble and disassemble their wheelchair, walking aid, or any other mobility equipment they may have with them.

There is an understandable policy objective of dis-incentivising UNNECESSARY car use in the city. Also it is understood that you intend the plan to be INCLUSIVE. However, as disabled drivers often have no manageable alternatives, increasing the proportion of Accessible bays in new developments and throughout the city centre could meet both objectives.
