Much of the Plan is very good, especially not building on the green belt but using brown field sites; many of the environmental plans + I endorse Sheffield + Rotherham Wildlife Trust's representation about this (I am a member); the improved cycle route north past Wardsend Cemetery and through the Millennium Park in Oughtibridge to link further north.

I do not feel there is sufficient strength to some of the ideas in the Plan e.g. the word 'enhance' is used many times without any reference to how much enhancement and how this will be monitored (planting 1 crocus bulb is an enhancement, but very small). There need to be reinforcements to these sections of the plan with specifics that can be measured.

There needs to be a plan to retro-fit the whole city with insulation during the time period of the plan.

The ground floor of the John Lewis building should be used as an accessible

Cycling infrastructure needs to be improved really significantly, again with measurable goals of increased usage. I worked for many years as a cycling instructor, also leading rides for women 3x/year for 13 years (continuing to help with these now) and I know that women ^{in particular} will not cycle regularly as a means of transport unless they feel safe. Despite the improvements to the Highway Code, this is not the case unless cycle routes are segregated and properly joined up, with a network covering the whole city. There is written evidence about this, which Paul Sullivan, council officer has - written by Pam Walton.
