



# Census 2021: Ethnic Group, National Identity, Language, and Religion Topic Summary

The source of all the data presented is the 2021 Census.

#### **Key points**

- 74.5% of people in Sheffield identified themselves as "White: English, Welsh, Scottish, Northern Irish or British", compared with 80.8% in 2011.
- 88.9% of people in Sheffield have one or more UK identity only (i.e. identify as being English, Scottish, Welsh, Northern Irish, Cornish or British).
- 9.1% have a non-UK identity only, and 1.9% of people have a UK identity and a non-UK identity.
- In 2021, 91.2% of people in Sheffield spoke English as their main language, compared with 92.6% in 2011.
- The percentage of people in Sheffield who identified as having no religion increased from 31.2% in 2011 to 43.4% in 2021.
- There was a fall in the number of people who identified as Christian from 52.5% to 38.5%, while the number of people who identified as Muslim increased from 7.7% to 10.3%.

#### **Ethnic Group**

Ethnicity data collected from the 2021 Census has been released by ONS at two levels, the first being high-level ethnic group with five categories (Asian, Asian British, Asian Welsh; Black, Black British, Black Welsh, Caribbean or African; Mixed or Multiple; White; Other ethnic group) further broken into 19 sub-categories, with the largest two in Sheffield being "White: English, Welsh, Scottish, Northern Irish or British" followed by "Asian, Asian British or Asian Welsh: Pakistani". See Table 1 in the Appendices for a breakdown of the Sheffield population by broad ethnic group.

The second, detailed ethnic group classification allowed respondents to define their own ethnicity. From this data, ONS built a dataset consisting of 287 different ethnic groups (285 of which are represented in Sheffield). Note that this does not include *all* ethnicities respondents provided, and there is still a degree of grouping in this category.

In 2021, 74.5% of people in Sheffield identified themselves as "White: English, Welsh, Scottish, Northern Irish or British", compared with 80.8% in 2011.

In absolute terms, the largest increases between 2011 and 2021 were in the "White: Other White", "Black, Black British, Black Welsh, Caribbean or African: African" and "Asian, Asian British or Asian Welsh: Pakistani" ethnic groups.

Census 2021 was the first census to collect "White: Roma" as a specific ethnic group, with 0.4% of people in Sheffield identifying themselves as White Roma. In the 2011 Census, it is likely that most of the individuals identifying as belonging to this ethnic group would have been grouped into the "White: Other White" category.

The largest of the detailed ethnic groups are shown in the table below.

#### **National Identity**

88.9% of people in Sheffield had a UK only identity. This is lower than in Yorkshire and the Humber (93.2%) and England as a whole (89.9%).

#### Language

The Census captures the main language of all people aged 3 and over. In 2021, 91.2% of people in Sheffield spoke English as their main language, compared with 92.6% in 2011.

A total of 1.8% of people spoke a South Asian language as their main language, with the most common being Urdu. There has been a slight fall in the percentage of people speaking the three most commonly spoken South Asian languages – Urdu, Panjabi, and Bengali – as their main language.

The most commonly spoken European languages were Slovak, Polish, and Romanian, with Slovak and Romanian having the largest increases of all of the most commonly spoken languages (shown in the table below).

### Religion

The religion question in the 2021 Census was a voluntary question for people aged 16 and over. 94.0% of people chose to answer the question.

The most common response to the religion question was 'no religion'; increasing from 31.2% of people in 2011 to 43.4% in 2021.

The proportion of people who were Christian fell from 52.5% in 2011 to 38.5% in 2021, while the proportion of people who were Muslim increased from 7.7% to 10.3%. See Table 2 in the Appendices for further information about religion
