Alternatively email or write, giving the grounds for your objection, by the 24th April 2025.

Any alterations to this Order which will render it less restrictive may be authorised by the Head of Strategic Transport, Sustainability and Infrastructure without the requirement to re-advertise the Order under Section 10(2) of the said Act, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the enabling Act or that a requirement of the enabling Act or any of the relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with may, within six weeks of 17th October 2024, make application for that purpose to the High Court.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

The Authority's reasons for proposing to make the above named Order(s) are as follows:-

- For avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising
- For facilitating the passage on the road
- For preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs

Explanatory Notes:-

A new business which is reliant on HGVs accessing/egressing the site is due to commence operation in the near future, however, current commuter parking practices are anticipated to impede access. As a consequence, it is proposed to promote an Experimental Traffic Order (ETO) to introduce a package of waiting restrictions to remove parking away from the accesses and nearby junctions. The ETO can stay in force for up to a maximum of 18 months while the effects are monitored and assessed to see if any amendments are required.

The proposed ETO will introduce the following: -

• No Waiting At Any Time on parts of Carlisle Street East, Garter Street and Petre Street.
